1. Help at St Mark's

- Talk to your neighbours, link gardens with 13cm square hole (too small for most pets)

- Register with a name and email for the free survey and resources
- Link with St Mark's to receive a Bronze, Silver or Gold certificate. We will next present certificates at our Harvest Service on 9 October creationcare.org.uk



5. Rest and Pray

- Pray for our current government and the new Prime Minister to come, we hold the COP26 presidency until November and need to set a good example to the rest of the world
- Pray for Local and County Councils, Chichester Diocese and St Mark's, as we tackle the climate and ecological emergency
