The Lord's My Shepherd - Psalm 23 Nature Trail at St. Mark's Church, Holbrook

As we work towards an Eco Church Gold Award, inspired by The Bible Society's awardwinning Psalm 23 Garden, designed by Sarah Eberle in RHS Chelsea Flower Show 2022, we have created a Psalm 23 Nature Trail in the gardens at St. Mark's.

Everyone is invited to wander and explore the gardens, take time to pause and reflect on Psalm 23, wonder at God's creation, think and pray, in a haven for people and wildlife.

- Green pastures church lawns and wildflower meadows
- Quiet waters pond near the woodland and nearby Chennells Brook
- Darkest valley winding path through the woodland
- Refreshes my soul sit, lie or simply pause in sun or shade, using your senses to ponder on the patterns and beauty of God's creation, listen for His still, small voice

Start by the church main entrance, taking 3 long, slow, deep breaths.

The Lord is my shepherd, I lack nothing.

Wander and explore the gardens around the church and hall. What are you drawn towards? Look at the detail of the patterns, colours, texture and smell of a tree, leaf, flower.

He makes me lie down in green pastures,

Wander on the grass, lie down, stand or sit awhile and listen.

What loud noises can you hear? What quiet sounds can you hear? What is the quietest sound?

Can you smell or taste anything?

Can you feel the sun, wind or rain?

How many colours and patterns can you see?

What is the biggest thing you can see? What is the smallest thing?

he leads me beside quiet waters,

Wander towards the pond, through the rose arch woodland entrance. What can you find to add to the Bug Church? Look out for tiny creatures.

he refreshes my soul.

Take more long, slow, deep breaths and listen to Psalm 23.

He guides me along the right paths for his name's sake.

Talk to God about your hopes, dreams, concerns and how you feel today. Ask God to guide you as you make any decisions. Invite God to comfort you. Psalm 23 applies while we are alive, towards the end of our lives and after death.

When we walk through the valley of death and when we face challenges or peaceful times, God is there, he longs to walk alongside us to help and comfort us.

Can you spot bird nest boxes, a hedgehog highway and solitary bee hotels? Did you see any birds, squirrels, frogs, butterflies, insects and other wildlife?

Winter	rose hips and berries, frost and snow patterns and footprints
